New business

The meeting started with an introduction of the members present. About 25 members attended the meeting. The GLOBECOM 2008 meeting minutes was approved first. Chandramouli then presented the membership statistics report prepared by Mainak Chatterjee. The report showed that the TCCN membership continues to increase. The membership is heterogeneous (several countries, industry, academic, government, etc.) . Chandramouli presented a report on IEEE DySPAN 2010 prepared by Petri

Mahonen. A decision was taken by TCCN to give two awards: for outstanding contribution to the community and best paper. There was discussion on whether these awards could be presented at DySPAN. But no final decision was taken. Paper submission for DySPAN is due on Oct. 15th. Poster sessions will be strengthened so that there is no perceived difference between poster and oral papers. A full day of 6 tutorials is planned. Planning is in progress and a strong TPC has been assembled.

The CFP for IEEE ICC 2010 was presented and discussed. The report was prepared by Sumit Roy.

Globecom 2009 report was presented. Mainak Chatterjee is the TCCN representative. He is one of the co-chairs of the SAC symposium and chairs the cognitive networks track in SAC. Topics and TPC list were presented. Cognitive networks track received 162 submissions out of the total of 380 submissions. This means that the cognitive network track continued to receive more than 50% of all the SAC submissions. 54 papers (33.3%) were accepted. A total of 9 sessions with 6 papers in each session is planned.

ICC 2009 report was presented by Suba Subbalakshmi. SAC in ICC 2009 received a total of 125 submissions. Cognitive networks track received 49 of these submissions. 19 out of 49 papers were accepted. 3 oral and 1 poster session were organized.

A special issue on dynamic spectrum access for wireless networks was organized in EURASIP Journal on Applied Signal Processing. 27 papers were submitted.

Joe Mitola and Honggang Zhang described an upcoming special issue on cognitive radio in IEEE Trans. on Vehicular Technology.
